Position

Reporting to an organizational board member and US Director, the African Farming Intern will compile research and test results including soil samples, to determine our 5-year farm plan with the input and assistance of our DRC farm team. The farm on our land in Democratic Republic of Congo supports orphaned children in our care village. This position requires strong research and analytical skills.

Desired individual will have a friendly personality; demonstrated professionalism and tact in communications with a diversity of individuals; strong organizational and time-management skills; acute attention to detail and ability to work well independently.

Hours and Compensation

Part-time 5-10 hours per week; unpaid internship with flexible remote office hours. We will work with Universities / Colleges to establish internship credit. Compensation will be reviewed at the ½ way point of the semester.

Responsibilities

- Support GOF programs in the Democratic Republic of Congo.
- Collect and analyze data from DRC staff.
- Prepare a 5-year guide on our best options for maximizing traditional crops as well as livestock.
- Conduct research on other NGO's working in DRC for future collaborations
